

IN RE THE MATTER OF ACCEPTING AN ADDITIONAL 667 FEET OF EASTWOOD LANE WHICH CURRENTLY RUNS FROM THE INTERSECTION OF VANDETTA ROAD 3,625 FEET INTO THE COUNTY ROAD SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, the Hopkins County Fiscal Court on its own Petition has expressed the desire to bring into the County Road System a portion of a public road named Eastwood Lane, which is described with more particularity as an additional 667 feet of Eastwood Lane which currently runs from the intersection of Vandetta Road 3,625 feet, and whose width is thirty (30) feet.

WHEREAS, notice was published according to KRS 178.050 and notices were placed at three public places in the vicinity of said road.

WHEREAS, two viewers were appointed by the Fiscal Court together with the County Road Supervisor, who viewed the proposed road establishment and reported in writing to a public hearing held on October 6, 2005.

WHEREAS, their report stated that the advantages which will result to the individual and public are: (1) Road has been rocked and ditched to county standards by the landowner; and (2) Road provides better turnaround for county equipment and the public.

WHEREAS, the Hopkins County Fiscal Court finds that establishment of the subject road is in the public interest in the following respects: (1) Road has been rocked and ditched to county standards by the landowner; and (2) Road provides better turnaround for county equipment and the public.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Fiscal Court of Hopkins County that the above-described portion of the public road named Eastwood Lane shall be brought into the Hopkins County Road System.

This Ordinance shall become effective upon publication.

First reading of this Ordinance was held on October 20, 2005.

Upon motion of Magistrate Riggs and seconded by Magistrate Rogers, the ordinance, was approved for its first reading on October 20, 2005. Whereupon the vote was called, and on roll call, the vote stood:


